Community Garden



The Feilding Oroua Rotary Club's Community Garden, known as the 'Brian Meads' Community Garden in honour of the late Rotarian Brian Meads, has contributed over 270 kilograms of fresh vegetables to Manchester House within just six months of its establishment. Spearheaded by Pip Scholte, Brian's daughter, who is both a dedicated Rotarian and gardener, the project serves as a tribute to her father while directly benefiting the community. The initiative kicked off in July last year with the introduction of raised garden beds, and a tunnel house was added in early October 2023. By late October 2023, Manchester House had already received its first batch of fresh vegetables for its food bank. Ann Williamson, the Executive Manager of Manchester House, expresses delight at the increased supply of fresh vegetables from the Community Garden to their food bank and sharing table, catering to the local demand for locally grown produce in the Feilding community and its neighboring areas.
